


SYMPHONY CHORUS Sat. Nov. 16 / 2:30 pm / Salem Church





The Symphony Chorus performs two concerts yearly, and often joins the Orchestra for choral masterworks. Singers from the area rehearse on Monday evenings and enjoy making music together. New vocalists are welcome. Auditions are held in August and December.
